# **RESOLUTION 2022 -32**

(Repealing Resolution 2008-62, Salary Relationship between Skamania County Elected Officials and Superior Court Judge; repealing 2002-48; and amending 2008-29)

WHEREAS, The Skamania County Board of Commissioners have the responsibility of setting salaries for the Board of Commissioners and the other Elected Officials in Skamania County; and

WHEREAS, Superior Court Judge's Salaries are set by the Washington Citizens Commission on Salaries for Elected Officials, of which 50% is paid by Washington State and 50% is paid by the county(s); and

WHEAREAS, in 2008 the Washington State Legislature recognized the dual role of the Prosecutor as both a State Officer and County Officer; and therefore, increased the State's contribution to the Prosecutor's salary to one-half of a Superior Court Judge's salary and required the County to continue to contribute to the salary no less than the 2008 salary amount; and

WHEAREAS, it is well recognized that County Government is an extension of State Government and all county elected officials are by default officers of the state; and

WHEAREAS, the Board of County Commissioners created a salary relationship between the County elected officials and the Superior Court Judge in 2008-62; and

WHEAREAS, the County desires to set Elected Officials salaries as a percentage of said Superior Court Judges to recognize the increase in Cost of Living, based on the 2021 inflation data, other county salary data and statewide housing market data: and

WHEAREAS, the County currently pays the following salary percentages of the Superior Court Judges from the 2008-62 resolution: Prosecutor (county portion) 37%-- Auditor, Assessor, Superior Court Clerk, Treasurer & Commissioners 38.5%-- Sheriff 48.2%; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners that the percent of Skamania County elected officials' salary be set as the following percentage of the Superior Court Judge's salary; Auditor, Assessor, Superior Court Clerk, and Treasurer 40.5%, Prosecutor (county portion) 37%,--- Sheriff 48.2%. Commissioners are to remain at 38.5%. Changes are effective retroactive to July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that should any portion of Resolution 2008-62 to be found in conflict with this resolution said portion is hereby amended or repealed.

#### **RESOLUTION 2008-62**

Creating a Salary Relationship between Skamania County Elected Officials and Superior Court Judge (And amending portions of resolutions 2002-48 and 2008-29)

WHEREAS, The Skamania County Board of Commissioners have the responsibility of setting salaries for the Board of Commissioners and other elected officials in Skamania County; and

WHEREAS, Superior Court Judge's Salaries are set by the Washington Citizens Commission on Salaries for Elected Officials, of which 50% is paid by Washington State and 50% is paid by the county(s); and

WHEREAS, In 2008 the Washington State Legislature recognized the dual role of the Prosecutor as both a State Officer and County Officer; and therefore increased the State's contribution to the Prosecutor's salary to one-half of a Superior Court Judge's salary and required the County to continue to contribute to the salary no less than the 2008 salary amount; and

WHEREAS, It is well recognized that County Government is an extension of State Government and all county elected officials are by default officers of the state; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners desires to create a salary relationship between County elected officials and the Superior Court Judge; and

WHEREAS, Proposed 2009 salaries are approximately the following percentages of the Superior Court Judge: Prosecutor (county portion) 37% -- Auditor, Assessor, Superior Court Clerk, Treasurer & . Commissioners 38.5% -- Sheriff 48.2%.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED; that beginning January 1st 2009, and thereafter when changes occurr, the salaries of Skamania County elected officials shall be set as the following percentage of the Superior Court Judge's salary, as set by the Washington Citizens Commission on Salary, as follows; Prosecutor (county portion) 37% --- Auditor, Assessor, Superior Court Clerk, Treasurer & Commissioners 38.5% --- Sheriff 48.2%; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**; that those portions of Resolution 2002-48 referring to the 2.5% annual increase for elected officials are amended to pertain only to the Commissioner representing district 3 until January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011; and

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED**; that should any portion of Resolution 2008-29 be found to be in conflict with this resolution said portion is hereby amended or repealed.

WHEREAS, the 2008 Legislature adopted Substitute Senate Bill (SSB) 6297 (Chapter 309, Laws of 2008) amending RCW 36.17.020 and changing the amount of the State's contribution to the elected prosecuting attorney salaries, effective July 1, 2008.

WHEREAS, the Legislature acknowledged that the elected county prosecuting attorney functions as both a state officer pursuing criminal cases on behalf of the state and as a county officer acting as counsel for the county; the responsibilities and decisions of the elected prosecuting attorney are essentially the same in every county of Washington, and the same high level of skill and expertise is needed in the least populous county as in the most populous county; and the Legislature further found that the salary of the elected prosecuting attorney should be tied to that of a Superior Court Judge;

WHEREAS, in recognition of the elected county prosecuting attorney's dual role as a State officer and County officer, former RCW 36.17.020 requires the State pay one-half of the salary of each elected prosecuting attorney, which salary is established for each County by the respective Boards of County Commissioners or County Councils of each County;

WHEREAS, the Skamania County Board of County Commissioners sets the salary of the Skamania County Prosecuting Attorney by resolution;

WHEREAS, under SSB 6297 (Chapter 309, Laws of 2008) the State of Washington increased the amount of the State's contribution to the salary of the elected county prosecuting attorney to one-half the annual amount of a Superior Court Judge's salary, and requires the County to continue to contribute to the salary of the elected prosecuting attorney at least the amount contributed in 2008;

WHEREAS, under RCW 2.08.092 the annual salary of a Superior Court Judge is set by the Washington Citizens' Commission on Salaries for Elected Officials; one-half of the Superior Court Judge's salary is currently \$70,489.50; on September 1, 2008, that amount shall increase to \$74,416.00; and one-half of the Prosecuting Attorney's salary for 2008 as previously set by the Board of County Commissioners is \$53,688.00; Now, Therefore,

# BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED:

1. The salary of the Prosecuting Attorney shall be \$124,177.00 effective July 1, 2008; and

2. The salary of the Prosecuting Attorney shall be \$128,104.00 effective September 1, 2008

## AS AMENDED BY THE HOUSE

- AN ACT Relating to elected prosecuting attorney salaries; amending RCW 36.17.020; creating new sections; and providing an effective date.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
  - NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that an elected county prosecuting attorney functions as both a state officer in pursuing criminal cases on behalf of the state of Washington, and as a county officer who acts as civil counsel for the county, and provides services to school districts and lesser taxing districts by statute.
    - The elected prosecuting attorney's dual role as a state officer and a county officer is reflected in various provisions of the state Constitution and within state statute.
    - The legislature finds that the responsibilities and decisions required of the elected prosecuting attorney are essentially the same in every county within Washington state, from a decision to seek the death penalty in an aggravated murder case, to the decision not to prosecute but refer an offender to drug court; from a decision to pursue child rape charges based solely upon the testimony of the child, to a decision to divert juvenile offenders out of the justice system.

Therefore, the legislature finds that elected prosecuting attorneys need to exercise the same level of skill and expertise in the least populous county as in the most populous county.

The legislature finds that the salary of the elected county prosecuting attorney should be tied to that of a superior court judge. This furthers the state's interests and responsibilities under the state Constitution, and is consistent with the current practice of several counties in Washington state, the practices of several other states, and the national district attorneys' association national standards.

11 Sec. 2. RCW 36.17.020 and 2001 c 73 s 3 are each amended to read 12 as follows:

The county legislative authority of each county or a county commissioner or councilmember salary commission which conforms with RCW 36.17.024 is authorized to establish the salaries of the elected officials of the county. ((One half of the salary of each prosecuting attorney shall be paid by the state.)) The state and county shall contribute to the costs of the salary of the elected prosecuting attorney as set forth in subsection (11) of this section. The annual salary of a county elected official shall not be less than the following:

- (1) In each county with a population of one million or more: Auditor, clerk, treasurer, sheriff, members of the county legislative authority, and coroner, eighteen thousand dollars; and assessor, nineteen thousand dollars((; and prosecuting attorney, thirty thousand three hundred dollars));
- (2) In each county with a population of from two hundred ten thousand to less than one million: Auditor, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars; clerk, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars; treasurer, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars; sheriff, nineteen thousand five hundred dollars; assessor, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars; ((prosecuting attorney, twenty-four thousand eight hundred dollars;)) members of the county legislative authority, nineteen thousand five hundred dollars; and coroner, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars;
- 36 (3) In each county with a population of from one hundred twenty-37 five thousand to less than two hundred ten thousand: Auditor, sixteen

thousand dollars; clerk, sixteen thousand dollars; treasurer, sixteen thousand dollars; sheriff, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars; assessor, sixteen thousand dollars; ((prosecuting attorney, twenty-four thousand eight-hundred dollars;)) members of the county legislative authority, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars; and coroner, sixteen thousand dollars;

- (4) In each county with a population of from seventy thousand to less than one hundred twenty-five thousand: Auditor, fourteen thousand nine hundred dollars; clerk, fourteen thousand nine hundred dollars; treasurer, fourteen thousand nine hundred dollars; assessor, fourteen thousand nine hundred dollars; sheriff, fourteen thousand nine hundred dollars; ((prosecuting attorney, twenty-three-thousand seven hundred dollars;)) members of the county legislative authority, fourteen thousand nine hundred dollars; and coroner, fourteen thousand nine hundred dollars;
- (5) In each county with a population of from forty thousand to less than seventy thousand: Auditor, thirteen thousand eight hundred dollars; clerk, thirteen thousand eight hundred dollars; treasurer, thirteen thousand eight hundred dollars; assessor, thirteen thousand eight hundred dollars; sheriff, thirteen thousand eight hundred dollars; ((prosecuting attorney, twenty three thousand seven hundred dollars;)) members of the county legislative authority, thirteen thousand eight hundred dollars; and coroner, thirteen thousand eight hundred dollars;
- (6) In each county with a population of from eighteen thousand to less than forty thousand: Auditor, twelve thousand one hundred dollars; clerk, twelve thousand one hundred dollars; treasurer, twelve thousand one hundred dollars; sheriff, twelve thousand one hundred dollars; assessor, twelve thousand one hundred dollars; ((prosecuting attorney in such a county in which there is no state university or college, fourteen thousand three hundred dollars; in such a county in which there is a state university or college, sixteen thousand five hundred dollars;)) and members of the county legislative authority, eleven thousand dollars;
- (7) In each county with a population of from twelve thousand to less than eighteen thousand: Auditor, ten thousand one hundred dollars; clerk, ten thousand one hundred dollars; treasurer, ten thousand one hundred dollars; assessor, ten thousand one hundred

dollars; sheriff, eleven thousand two hundred dollars; ((prosecuting attorney, thirteen thousand two hundred dollars;)) and members of the county legislative authority, nine thousand four hundred dollars;

- (8) In each county with a population of from eight thousand to less than twelve thousand: Auditor, ten thousand one hundred dollars; clerk, ten thousand one hundred dollars; treasurer, ten thousand one hundred dollars; assessor, ten thousand one hundred dollars; sheriff, eleven thousand two hundred dollars; ((prosecuting attorney, nine thousand nine hundred dollars;)) and members of the county legislative authority, seven thousand dollars;
- (9) In each county with a population of from five thousand to less than eight thousand: Auditor, nine thousand one hundred dollars; clerk, nine thousand one hundred dollars; treasurer, nine thousand one hundred dollars; assessor, nine thousand one hundred dollars; sheriff, ten thousand five hundred dollars; ((prosecuting attorney, nine thousand nine hundred dollars;)) and members of the county legislative authority, six thousand five hundred dollars;
- (10) In each other county: Auditor, nine thousand one hundred dollars; clerk, nine thousand one hundred dollars; treasurer, nine thousand one hundred dollars; sheriff, ten thousand five hundred dollars; assessor, nine thousand one hundred dollars; ((prosecuting attorney, nine thousand nine hundred dollars;)) and members of the county legislative authority, six thousand five hundred dollars;
- 24 (11) The state of Washington shall contribute an amount equal to
  25 one-half the salary of a superior court judge towards the salary of the
  26 elected prosecuting attorney. Upon receipt of the state contribution,
  27 a county shall continue to contribute towards the salary of the elected
  28 prosecuting attorney in an amount that equals or exceeds that
  29 contributed by the county in 2008.
- 30 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. This act takes effect July 1, 2008.
- NEW SECTION. Sac. 4. If specific funding for the purposes of this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by June 30, 2008, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act is null and void.

## **RESOLUTION 2002-48**

(Amending portions of Resolution 2000-19 the annual increase of members of the Board of County Commissioners and other Elected Officials)

WHEREAS, Skamania County Board of Commissioners has the responsibility of setting salaries for the Board of Commissioners and other elected officials in Skamania County; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed a letter dated July 3, 2002 from the elected officials that recommends reducing the annual increase, on salary comparisons and internal equity with Department Heads and comparisons with other similar counties; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the salaries of the Commissioners, Treasurer, Auditor, Assessor, Clerk, Sheriff and Prosecuting Attorney are internally equitable among Skamania County personnel, officials and similar counties; and

WHEREAS, Skamania County elected officials and employees have received limited salary increases in the past in lieu of full payment of health insurance benefits, resulting in a higher benefit package and lower salary package than similar counties; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the elected officials participating in the Washington State Retirement System, to begin to rebalance the compensation offered by Skamania County between salaries and benefits:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners hereby amends that portion of Resolution 1998-49 that provides for a 2.5% increase on January 1 on each year after 1998 to the following:

- The Auditor, Assessor, Treasurer, Clerk, Sheriff, and Prosecuting Attorney shall each receive a \$100 per month increase in their salary beginning March 1, 2003 or the first month in which a Section 125 Cafeteria Plan is implemented for Skamania County, whichever date is later. Beginning with the month in which the salary increase is effective, each elected official shall reimburse the County \$100 per month for the partial cost of health insurance premiums. This deduction may be paid through contributions made to a Section 125 plan. Until such time as the salary increase shall occur, the County shall pay the increase cost of the health insurance premium.
- b) The current Commissioners, who do not participate in the Washington State Retirement System and would receive no benefit from changing benefits into salary, shall receive no increase in salary for 2003, but the County shall pay the increase in their health insurance premiums for all of 2003.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the annual increase remains 2.5% for subsequent years, unless further amended; and

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** except as herein modified, Resolution 1998-49 and 2000-19 are hereby reaffirmed.
