Planning

- Hearing Examiner approved Columbia Gorge Getaways CUP on May 2, 2022.
- Continuing to work on Storedahl Quarry EIS. Draft studies and reports should be complete by end of June.
- Current planning workload consists of short plat/subdivision applications, National Scenic Area development reviews, critical areas/shoreline reviews, and contract with Bingen.
