LIVESTOCK PROJECTS BUILD COMMUNITIES

Each year youth select livestock projects to raise throughout the year (or years in some cases) and then bring them to show to be judged at the Skamania County Fair. In addition to the expense of purchasing their animal, feed, and supplies, these projects require hours of attention to feed, train, and prepare for the show. The youth learn essential life skills such as communication, teamwork, cooperation, and responsibility, along with the humane treatment of animals.

4-H and Market Livestock projects provide opportunities for young people to develop solid values that will serve their community, wherever they live. The Skamania County Livestock Auction provides the community an opportunity to invest in our youth and their future. Proceeds from the sale of projects often fund college educations, enhancing the ability of these youth to contribute to their communities. As a buyer, your participation in the sale recognizes youth for the time, expense, and effort that has gone into raising an animal for market. You may also obtain advertising value that accrues through the purchase of these animals. Please consider supporting our local youth at the Skamania County Youth Market Sale.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- You must have a Buyer's Number to purchase.
- All purchases must be paid in full by 30 days after the sale. After 30 days, a 2% late fee will be added for each month the purchases are not paid in full.

HOME USE

You can purchase the entire animal for home use. You pay the total sale price bid at the time of the sale. You will need to designate at the time of the sale whether or not you wish to have your animal processed. You will have the choice of a processor at checkout, hauled by Ed's Custom Cutting, and your youth producer will load the animal into the appropriate haul trailer, and the meat processor will contact you for cutting and wrapping directions. Bid price does not include processing fees. Buyer is responsible to confirm all processing arrangements.

BUY BACK

Buyers <u>not</u> wanting to keep their purchased animal pay only the difference between the final bid price and resale value listed in the Market Sale Book. Another buyer will pay the resale value and take the animal. The resale value will be published in the Market Sale Book.

For example, suppose you bid \$4/lb for a 100-pound lamb with a \$1/lb resale price. The buy back price is then \$100.

Your final cost = \$300 [\$400 - \$100]

WAYS TO BUY + SUPPORT YOUTH

ADD ON SUPPORT

A person can also provide an additional bid amount towards a specific exhibitor who is participating in the market sale. Many use this option when they are not the highest bidder. This also occurs when a person can't make it to the sale or has multiple kids they wish to support.

Add-Ons will only be accepted online this year on the auction website.

Auction will be open for Add-Ons only until August 27th at noon.

DONATION

Donate the meat from your purchase to one or more non-profit organizations. Youth benefit from your support and you get the satisfaction of knowing that your favorite organization gets the meat. You may also consider arranging with the recipient to pay the processing fees.

HOW TO MAKE A PURCHASE

- 1. Register with the sales table when you arrive (or pre-register) and get your bidding number.
- 2. Look through the Market Sale Book (provided day of) for the auction order and identify animals you're interested in.
- 3. When you wish to place a bid on the animal in the ring, raise your bidder number until your bid is acknowledged. Bids are based on dollars per pound or per pen/animal as noted in Market Sale Book. The buyer is the highest bidder.
- 4. Upon being recognized as the buyer, you will be asked for your buyer number.
- 5. When you are done bidding on animals, you can go to the cashier table to check out and pay for your purchases. Payment can be made with cash, check, or major credit cards (plus a small processing fee). You will verify the sale price and indicate what you wish to do with your animal.

CONSIDER PRE-REGISTERING!

Bidders can pre-register on the auction site (same site as last year) beginning August 13th. This allows you to look through all animals and make add-on contributions as early as a few hours before the auction! Use the links under "Add-On Support" to the left.
